



11. What information is the most important to include in our monthly E News to all members?







- Easy access to information about refereeing on the Website, the website is not easy to navigate, even by using the search engine. Much better than it was but still can be more



39. Please enter any other comments regarding Volleyball England membership or services that are currently or could be offered.

- Very pleased with the overall service.
- More relevant and up to date information.
- We need a wall planner with all events (especially all summer tournaments/festivals) printed at the beginning of each year/season please
- GRASS ROOTS. I know that a lot of attention has been placed on getting the GB squad ready for 2012. How much long term impact will this have on our sporting culture? Next year let's get back to grass roots. Pushing volleyball at teacher training colleges Requiring NVL clubs to have a junior academy section, feeding the regional and national academy structure. Reduced affliation rates for clubs to thriving junior sections.
- Very often forthcoming events in 3 touch have happened before the copy arrives through the letter box. The efforts to encourage young people in local areas to become referees and volunteer to support local tournaments do not yet seem to be paying dividends. I still have to rely far too heavily on on using the 'ageing volleyball community' and the number is dwindling.
- Sports development and player development upon the looks is low, i may not be informed since i am new in this country, i dont see lots of players as much as england would have
- Keep up a good work!!!
- My main concern is for the future of the game. Many clubs (ours included) are only surviving due to an influx of players from other EU countries. That influx is a good thing those players are very welcome but I worry about sustainability. We have made little progress in schools for as long as I can remember (I started at school back in the 70s). Grass roots continue to be

neglected. The push-pull argument (grass roots- elite level) seems to be out of balance. Volleyball is the best indoor participation sport going for kids: it is ideally suited to UK school sports. We have failed to get that message across to teachers.

- I personally think that the Volleyball England membership offers any stand out incentives! The services offered to members is limited and confusing at best. There are no opportunities for members to offer opinions in an open debate and the way that members are treat is poor at best! The head office infastructure is confusing and some of the response times are poor to say the least. Unfortunately is seems in a lot of cases that any attempt to develop the game in the Regions I am in is only a token gesture
- The most important point I want to make is that I feel that Volleyball England has destroyed the lower league structure. From their goal to reality this is a disaster. I feel they are only interested in the top section of the league. Without the lower leagues giving players the experience to start their volleyball career the chance of developing home grown volleyball will die. I have nothing against this, but the league is currently made up of a high majority of foreign players, who had had the opportunity to be trained at school, play at the lower leagues and work their way through to a higher level. Without the support of international players, there simply would be a league structure half the size it is. Over the 20 years I have played Volleyball I have seen the number of teams and registered player dwindle to this very poor level that it is now. Membership revenue is a fraction of what it was. With the implementation of costly officials even in the lower levels the cost associate to this makes it impossible for younger players to participate. I think there needs to be some serious re-thinking and consultation with the clubs, on how Volleyball England can attract more players into National League, rather than push them into the regional leagues. Steve Grimes
- Kettering is an excellent centre but can be difficult to get to by public transport holding some events/conferences around the country might make attendance easier.
- I have been disappointed with the support the office staff at VE have given us over the last year regarding developing volleyball in the local area. Message are left, emails are sent but most of the time there are no relies and you have to chase them or have to give up. Better service is required from our governing body over personal contact. Maybe have one person who is a conduit for each region who fields calls/emails and ensures that they are acted on.

- I don't wish VE to waste its resources thinking up spuriously related 'offers' for its membership package. Just deliver well run sport.
- After 10 years, I have stopped registering myself as a ref and coach as it is far too expensive for what it is.
- it's really hard to run a club, don't expect people to accept fees to rise every year forever. If this
 keeps going, there will be only universities who can access a cheap hall that will enter the NVL.
 There should be a global answer to that.
- Very helpful staff, always ready to answer a question. Thank you
- The Beach Commission must remember that the North East Of England has outstanding beaches and facilities. We know it may take a couple of hours to get here but it should be on the circuit "we are England as much as the south coast".
- There is still a need to develop the benefits to clubs and individuals. The most important benefit so far is insurance. Coach and referee resources should be developed as a once a year conference is insufficient. Reliance on the web site is also too great and there is a need to be more proactive in developing and promoting the resources therein. That said, we are in as MUCH stronger position than we were only a few years ago.
- 3Touch is a welcome arrival on the doormat, it covers a good range of events and issues. However, in some cases the background colour, bright or dark, makes the type difficult to read especially when the type is white.
- Apart from the posibility to play National League and to check the league table online, I am not aware of any other benefits from Volleyball England.

I have helped the Christ Church University Volleyball Club with equipment and time to train and enthusism which in turn has meant that the students of the men's vb club have entered the BUCS League system and the ladies have entered the Kent League system and they have just helped as volenteers at the Margate VEBT and are very keen to get more involved i want them to be more involved and to spread the word. - Even with the change in School Sports Partnerships there is still a need to keep SSPs that exist informed of developments. Schoolos need even greater support and guidance especially as Change\$Llfe clubs could be expanded further.
- In the 2010/2011 season, Volleyball England was noticed more for its absence in my region, then for actually being proactive and helpful. At times, I have forgotten we even had a NGB in the sport.
- Support for clubs in areas where volleyball is under-represented.
- I know that this is not an easy goal to be achieved, as it depends of other institutions. But, as the development of any sport starts in young ages, volleyball needs to be inserted in the schools, namely in the PE curriculum.

- Volleyball England are way behind in the way they calculate traveling expences. I find that the fee of 20ppm is absolutely rediculasly low. As you are not taking into consideration ware and tare on our cars, considering we use our cars a lot for the benifit of VBE. I think a minimum of 30ppm should be considered this year with rises regularly in line with fuel cost rises. You can not expext us to continue to give such a good service to VBE and teams when it is apparent that it cost us money to do this. - too much emphasis on top level volleyball and no mention of 'recreational' volleyball recreational volleyballers are often feed local and regional volleyball, and add a sense of fun to the sports ... it is a different route from the grass routes youth centered approach (which is invaluable of course), but it is nonetheless a key means of getting all ages interested in the

sport. i run a number of summer leagues and a number of other events / tournaments that have encouraged hunderds to join the sport over the years, and it benefits from a more relaxed introduction, less beaurocracy, thus less deterrents. Perhaps there is room for a focus on this aspect of the sport in order to open it up to the masses, rather than the dedicated elite.

- One big calendar would be helpful on the website. One where all the upcoming and previous event dates on it.
- Communication and current practices in the Talent Development Programmes is appalling. Other aspects of VE appear to be much more volunteer friendly although appear to be uncoordinated.
- Can 3Touch be made more appealing rather than a work journal, to invite readers to read. it needs to be more uplifting and contemporary Clubs should be chased for info as i don't believe they think to send reports in can the mag be made available to view on-line for all those members who do not have access to it? Thanks
- More support for secretaries so that they are not left to arrange their own fixtures at the end of
 each season and only give ten days to sort out a role that should be done by VE as part of
 membership fee/governing body responsibility.
- I think that because of the lack of interest in volleyball as a whole in England there should be
 more emphasis on regional play. the london league is very strong because of lots of players
 from other countries, normally in regional leagues there is one or two strong teams that have
 no competition. i think a possible answer to this is more interregional play, making regional
 teams a more developed thing. this would bring more quality out of the woodwork, it would
 make it easier for talent to get involved in a sport that they might not see as worth while and
 also fairly clique.
- I feel that there are members of VE who work for the junior section who need to listen more to experienced people in the game. We tend to be a sport where coaches want the best for the young people so when several people are giving advice on what is best for young people you should listen. I was particularly disappointed that young players who had prepared for over 2 years to compete in a national competition were unable to because of bad timing ie in a school holiday. The national festival at PGL was another example of poor communication. Please realise those involved in junior volleyball are volunteers who want to work with you. Please see us as a valuable resource and partner not a threat.
- Membership of Volleyball England is very good value for money for our Club. On a personal basis I'm getting a bit long in the tooth for some of the initiatives!
- would be great if i could join as a proper member.
- I personally think that Clubs are having to apy out far too much money to sustain what they like doing, i.e. to play competitive volleyball. On one hand, volleyball is meant to be promoted to attract a larger amount of playes, however, the existing players do not seem to be supported at all.We are a small Club with few members and are unfortunately located in the very isolated South West. Whenever we receive the new fixtures for a season, it feels like we are purposefully victimised by the pairings or triangular matches we receive. Quite frequently, we have to travel to the furthest opponents, rather than trying to allocate fixtures in a way that teams cam meet somewhere in the middle (through a triangular for example). The amount of travel costs we have accumulated over the years is unbelievable and we are now getting to the point that we can probably not afford another season after 2011/12, unless we charge each member something in the region of £ 500 for their membership. This sum would indicate in itself that we would be unlikely to maintain a squad, and I believe that we are not the only squad struggling with similar problems. For us here in the South West, it feels that volleyball is only supported and regionally promoted if a club is allocated somewhere in the Loughborough - Sheffield area. Again, that to me appears to contradict the desire of Volleyball England to promote the sport nationally. maybe something to finally consider for the commissioners and other office-based people at headquarters. Thank you
- better fees for referees, more practice courses
- the registration fees for referees for the forthcoming season is too high
- A previously said, it would be good to be able to book on a weekend at kettering and be coached ourselves by more experienced coaches. Too much emphasis is being put on beach and I feel indoor volleyball will suffer. Local league for adults is also seems unimportant, whilst

juniors and national league teams are the only focus. What proportion of membership is form 'local' league?

- Super 6 at Regional Comps should be reintroduced. Think only MVP got recognition, needs to

 their time to the sport already. I pay tp play, to coach, to ref seems a lot to give. Perhaps one
 free registration per club for coach and or ref?
- I think the website should be more clear and updated more regularly, especially concerning the national teams The benefits of the memberships should be more clear.
- I object strongly to your use of the term 'professional staff' in the above questionnaire. I feel it deepens the rift between those employed by the association and the real volunteers who run the clubs and leagues. It reflects the recent downgrading of these volunteers in both their constitutional rights and their access to/ control of any form of expenditure. Head office is on a collision course with the people who play and run the game and do it for the love of the sport. A number of other sports have gone through the same issues with their governing body head office and this has led to the formation of several break-away parallel governing bodies. Volleyball England seems to me to be heading in that direction, the gulf between head office and the board and the membership was clearly exposed by the very low attendance at this year's AGM.
- We need to find ways of funding VEBT tour events in particular Sandbanks which apparently didn't go ahead because of the cost of installing spectator stands. How can we raise the profile of beach if these VEBT tour events don't go ahead? Is it not possible to share the expense of installing stands with other organisations by running the VEBT one weekend and another beach based sport the next. Last year it was a POLO what about foot volley?

- Generally good but more funding needed and promotion of new teams. I am finding it hard to hire out sports hall in our local area because badminton is always played there. I know Volleyball England can do little for this but if there was a way to get more councils to operate their clubs for volleyball maybe at a discounted rate???
- Buy GB/England kit replicas at reduced prices Access to posters/templates/pictures on white background rather than the ones on the Volley 123 memory stick with a variety of players/ages etc. on them
- More face to face contact
- I am really pleased to see the Go Spike campaign get going, it is great to see that Volleyball is becoming the focus of Volleyball England's work and I really do like the concept behind this scheme. However I question how many people really understand what it is and how they can get involved? I also think that things need to be carried out on time more often. Too often this season 'unforeseen circumstances' have prevented this, that, or the other from happening. In

reality though, these circumstance can't that often be unforeseen and rather it is a case of poor planning and a lack of foresight. Once a deadline is set it should be adheared to, to act otherwise deminishes confidence in the ability of the organisation to function properly.
