

- It is not difficult to get volunteers. But the type that are needed need to know something
 of volleyball. We need people who will take responsibility for projects not just help from
 time to time. They should also want to spend their time helping to a volleyball club.
 They need to want to be involved for several years.
- Another volleyball development officer and VE academy status
- As with most Clubs, the same few doing the essential work & roles with most members just wanting to train & play.
- The whole club functions around volunteers and is reliant on subs paid by players to facilitate volleyball. It would be great to have paid staff, but who would pay?
 Sponsorship for small clubs is very small and hit and miss in today's economic climate with many other sports chasing the same money, so paid staff is just a dream at the moment.
- Coaching and refereeing courses are so expensive and more importantly take a lot of people's time (e.g. 24 hours) so nobody wants to do them

- We have an excellent coach who is well qualified, very experienced and can referee but
 we do not have enough players. We have had to stop sessions and give the hours to
 another sport that is better attended.
- Time is often a barrier for volunteers attending courses, particular
- It has been an issue that coaching courses have been cancelled often at short notice. Time is often a factor affecting the availability of volunteers. Cost of fuel is an issue in the South West as travel is often required to get to training, games and courses.
- Current workforce is 2 F/T and 2 P/T staff = 3 staff. This was reduced in Nov 2011 with a
 national restructure of the prison service regrettably therefore further reductions could
 arise
- MAIN CLUB VOLUNTEER WOULD LIKE TO TAKE EXTERNAL QUALIFICATION OR EXTERNAL COACH
- As we are a college there is no such "workforce" more lecturers delivering the sport rather than actual coaches of this particular sport.
- We as a club could do with more players that would then most probably help out and maybe train as coaches/ref/be on the committee. At the moment I am club secretary but also assistant treasurer, welfare office, book hall, first aider and ref as well as a player (plus i am employed and have 4 children)
- We as a club could do with more players that would then most probably help out and maybe train as coaches/ref/be on the committee. At the moment I am club secretary but also assistant treasurer, welfare office, book hall, first aider and ref as well as a player (plus i am employed and have 4 children)
- I think our main barriers to growth are lack of volunteers to take on extra responsility (for example if we wanted to push youth development) and to give their time. We have occasional opportunities to attend Refs courses but our aging squad cannot usually devote 3 weekend days to it.
- Current Staff all able to Coach existing players and promote new players (This is reliant on current Prison Population)
- Our club is run by a handful of local players, two are coaches and refs, the rest are just
 players that chip in to help wherever we can! We also have a large number of university
 members playing and currently have three teams in the league. I think it would be
 beneficial to the club to train a few of the local players in reffing and basic coaching
 techniques so as not to over stretch the two we have already.
- More level 1 and 2 coaching courses within the South West
- With around 200 players and 30+ teams, we have to spread the workload round the club.
 Even so, Lynn Allen spends at least 20 hours a week administering the club. We have 5

coaches who get paid to coach in local schools. About 30 local schools play volleyball, enter our schools competitions and contribute players to our junior programme.




- Various locations, but apart from the beach no volleyball specific site. this is the next step for the club a specific venue, which is equal in importance to gaining VE academy status to give us increase expertise and time available for coaches to train.
- Very reasonable for staging NVL standard matches & training sessions. Goodwill is priceless, hence supporting local venues.
- There are different posts at each venue. Although Tor Bridge is a new venue, it only has a single bolt post set up. The main reason is that there is a lack of knowledge of what is required when decisions are made by people who have not been involved in volleyball. Such knowledge needs to be available right at the planning stage for new builds, and should be available to sports centre / PE staff for potential sports hall up grades.

- trouble for us is getting extra time for training after the college use the hall or its rented out to pay for itself, there is no evening time left

- We wanted a Wall Net Slider to accommodate larger training numbers but as the Dome does not have walls (it is inflatable) then there is nowhere to attach it.
- Not able to train and play at same venue; very expensive so can only train once per week
- Q 21, semi permanent beach courts
- The posts are own by the community school but are not that well looked after. We have to usually repair them every time we get them out of the storage room. No padding on post and we have no ref stand so we are breaking H & S rules and have to use a table to stand on when ref matches. The hall is an ideal venue but just so expensive to hire out for a small club. I only book the hall each week for the number of players that turn up as so we can cover the costs. It doesn't encourage people to do sport when the hire of the halls are so much.
- The facilities at our venue are among the best in the south west! really cant complain about any aspect of the venue, especially when we have seen what other clubs have to train in!
- South Bristol Sports Centre is a fantastic new venue with a sprung wooden floor and volleyball court marked out. Unfortunately we can't access it as the providers say volleyball isn't a partner and therefore not a priority.

- AS AN ADULT PRISON WE CANNOT HAVE UNDER 18S IN THE JAIL.
- The role of the development officer is link in with the club, college and many schools and community groups which work really well and ensures a great partnership and benefits for all.
- This will always be more difficult when approaching a school where there is no staff
 member with any knowledge ' playing experience of volleyball as they tend to promote
 'their own' sports, i.e not volleyball. The main aim is to convince staff of the benefits of
 playing VB and to get them playing and qualified so that VB can start within a school.
- No problem for myself to go in and help run some fun sessions (even though i am not a qualified coach) i would even take days off my employment to go into the school to help run a session or two. To get hall hire cost down the school stated for 10 weeks we would have to pay upfront £236 for 10 X 1 hour session but as we need 2 hour session we would have to pay nearly £500 for 10 X 2 hours session upfront this is the type of money we as a small club don't have. To cover our shortfall some weeks i have done some fundraising eg prize bingo's. So hard for a club to survive with such overheads to pay for.
- uni club volunteers at local schools when the university has a scheme on
- Basketball and Cricket have become very popular in and around Bristol over the last 5
 years as they have seen sustained investment into professional coaches who can go
 into schools and lead sessions for young people. Many young people aren't aware of
 volleyball and because of the other sports and their access choose to play them
 instead.
- Although I say No to 31, it is because we are in transition at the moment, trying to set up an academy, so it would be difficult to have the time.
- With more finance we could get coaching in over 50 schools, offer more junior sessions and have over 600 youngsters playing regularly.
- The change of Mount Bay to an academy has had an impact on the possibility of still working with the school.
- School finishes 3.20pm difficult to get coaches at this time. The school uses the same sports hall as the club - it is community usage in the evenings. The difficulty is knowing who to contact and where to start, so support from Volleyball England would be really helpful.




35. Would your club be interested in support from Volleyball England to help you to (further) develop a link with a local college / FE institution?



- We struggle to find players who are interested any able to play. Part of the barrier is the cost to participate: court fees, NVL registration, transportation etc.
- As a uniquely situated community our capacity to expand and develop is constrained by the priority to manage and supervise a challenging population. As alluded to earlier I would really like to be able to expand in a number of areas, however the current economic climate and radical restructure within the Prison Service precludes me from doing so.
- We are currently running the Club at the maximum membership given the volunteers available to run it.
- A LOT OF STUDENTS WHO DON'T PLAY REGULARLY ENJOY GOING TO THE STUDENT CUP IT'S A BIT OF FUN AND GETS NEW PEOPLE INVOLVED!
- We are only a small club but offer people of all abilities to join as long as they have some sporting background.
- VENUE PROBLEMS NOT TRAINING AT THE MOMENT AS CAN'T FIND A SUITBALE TIME AND PLACE. OTHERWISE WOULD BE HAPPY TO OFFER OPEN SESSIONS.
- The cost of affiliating clubs and leagues to volleyball england is a real barrier in Bristol.
 The Bristol and District Volleyball League has 10 teams of which I reckon 3 affiliate to
 volleyball england, many cannot see the value in £80 simply to get insurance and a
 magazine.
- The problem really is reaching out and finding people. It is about effective marketing.
