### **Volleyball Futures Cardiff**



Cardiff Celts VC are running a free junior coaching clinic on Sat March 28, 10am to 1pm at USW in Pontypridd (poster attached) in association and funded by Volleyball England as part of their Volleyball Futures Initiative in the SW regions.

#### Volleyball Beginners Coaching Clinic Poster

It is for both beginner players AND teachers/coaches and it is aimed at boys & girls age 8 to 14. The event is ALSO for teachers, coaches, etc to show/teach them how best to introduce the game of volleyball to beginners.

The aim is to support and encourage more schools, youth groups etc to be able to introduce volleyball to the children where they are. The lead coach is a volleyball England staff tutor. And he will be teaching the adults how to introduce the fundamentals of volleyball in a fun and game-like way.

The event is free to attend. It would be great if we could get as many interested parents, coaches and teachers as possible to this event. I would be very grateful if you could circulate it amongst your club members, local schools and anyone that you think might be interested. Please come yourself!

At the event I am keen to promote all the local Volleyball Clubs so that any children interested in playing more volleyball can join the club that is nearest to them and/or on a day that is convenient. It is not about Cardiff Celts solely promoting our junior sessions.

To book – both for the players and the adults – please ask them to email me. Places are limited to about 24 coaches/teachers (adults) and 30 players

## SW Champs Entries – Open 7th March at 10am



This year's SW Champs entry procedure has now been confirmed by the SW committee. A maximum of 28 teams can enter the SW Championships and places will be allocated in two rounds until the event is full on a first come first served basis. Existing South West and National League teams will be given priority under Round One. All other teams within the SW region can enter under Round Two.

#### **Round One:**

- Round One will open at 10am on Saturday 7th March for all SW League and VE National League teams.
- Clubs can enter up to two teams per gender from their existing NVL and SW League teams.
- All entries will be via an online form on the SWVA web site (first come first served).
- Once received, payment details will be emailed shortly afterwards (BACS, Paypal or Cheque),
   payment must be received before Round Two opens to confirm your place under round One.

#### **Round Two:**

- Round Two will open on Saturday 14th March at 10am, for all teams located within the SWVA region from the SW, NL, Local, BUCS and SW Crown Services programs.
- Clubs limited to a max of two qualifying teams per gender under round one, can now enter a third
  or fourth qualifying team if required (note all teams entered must be playing this season in NVL,
  SW, Local, BUCS or Crown Services competitions).
- All Places not confirmed under round One (i.e. payment not received) will be reallocated, team
  can re-apply under round Two.
- Payment details will be emailed shortly afterwards (BACS, Paypal or Cheque), payment must be received within one week of receiving the email to confirm your place.

Please note that this tournament is the South West's elite competition to find the best team in the region. Teams are therefore expected to select their players from their current registration lists and the organizers reserve the right to apply sanctions to the club for future events for obvious transgressions.

9.5m long 3mm braided nylon mesh. Banded on all four sides to help tensioning. Steel head line and cord bottom line (No antennae sheaths with nets)

"If a team is looking to enter for the first time, then I'd really encourage them to enter early as some divisions can be sold out in as little as 30 minutes. We always take care to keep all teams informed both before and during the tournament."

One team who epitomise the ethos of the tournament is Purbrook Park as Kate explained: "They were all students at school together and now, years later, they take part in the men's side of the tournament dressed in school shirts and ties! Organised by the City of Bristol Volleyball Club, the success of Whitefield is down to the 50+ strong volunteer workforce whose effort and dedication extends beyond the tournament weekend to months of planning and preparation.

## Volleyball England statement on the coronavirus

Volleyball England has issued the following advice in response to the spread of COVID-19 coronavirus and the enquiries we have received from members.

Pre and post-match handshakes will be relaxed for the foreseeable future. Referees, coaches and players are advised to wave or bow instead as a small, precautionary measure to lessen personal contact and to help stop the spread of the disease. In addition, members may want to hold off on greetings and congratulatory touches at matches as this could aid the spread of the disease.

Also, keep in regular contact with the owners of your facility, to ensure you're up to date with their guidance, and make sure you have appropriate hand washing facilities.

To help stop the spread of germs, the NHS is advising members of the public to do the following:

- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or
- Put used tissues in the bin immediately
- Regularly wash your hands with soap and water use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- Try to avoid close contact with people who are unwell

Volleyball England would also like to clarify that no match will be cancelled by Volleyball England as a result of the coronavirus unless we are instructed to do so by the government.
