## **SW Junior Training 2021-22**



We are please to anounce that we are back in business with our U15 & U17 South West Junior monthly Training program for the 2021-22 season from September to April next year.

- The training is run to offer opportunities for young players to improve their play by working with the regional squad coaches.
- To have the opportunity to meet other young players from around the region and enjoy working with a large 'same age group'.
- To prepare Regional Representative teams to compete in the National Inter Regional Championships.

All sessions are open to all juniors in the SWVA Region (SW Eng, S. Wales), the first will be in Wellsway LC in Bristol, the U15's will be in Parkstone Grammer, Poole in October but everything else will be at the Riverside LC in Exeter (which has now fully re-opened following the fire four years ago).

Age groups is the school year, this means that you must be Under 15 or U17 on August 31st 2021. Girls & Boys younger than 13 may train by prior agreement.



You will need to <u>Book & Pay</u> for each session in advance. The sessions are £12 (3h) or £15 (4h), depending on the length of each session and currently limited to 27 players.

All bookings will close on the preceding Friday evening at 23:45 and payments will be non refundable or transferable. If you have a credit or voucher from an earlier session, please enter the ticket code in the "Do you have a promo code".

# New assistant coach award coincides with courses re-launch

We are delighted to announce the long-awaited return of coaching courses and workshops, with a Level 2 Coaching Volleyball course in Ashcombe on 28<sup>th</sup> August set to be the first to take place since before lockdown.

Conversations are taking place to swiftly organise a cluster of dates across the country to help the backlog of coaches who have had their professional development stalled by the Covid-19 pandemic.

However, one of the major obstacles to courses returning is the availability of venues. In the meanwhile, we are seeking learners for a Level 2 course in Newark across 21st-22nd August and 18th-19th September. Please use this form to reserve a place.

#### **Assistant Coach Award**

In further exciting news, we are currently piloting a new Assistant Coach Award. Developed during lockdown, this new award will be the first formal step on our Coach Education Pathway and covers the disciplines of indoor volleyball, beach volleyball, and sitting volleyball. It will replace our Level 1 Introduction to Coaching Volleyball Award.

The Assistant Coach Award will introduce learners to volleyball fundamentals that underpin the development of the dig, volley, block, serve, and spike skills, as well as Volleyball England's game-based approach to coaching.

Upon completion of this eight-week blended course – two virtual classroom sessions, a one day face-to-face practical session and online studies – learners

will become qualified to assist coaches in delivering volleyball sessions for senior beginners or social players.

Learners will each receive a free Volleyball England coach membership for their first season, a 12-month UK Coaching subscription, and a resource pack for the course fee of £150.

Natasha Buckland, Project Lead for Workforce Development & Courses, said: "Courses are essential for the development of coaches and so we are delighted they are now back online after being temporarily stopped by the Covid-19 pandemic."

Blended learning is also being piloted on the Grade 4 Refereeing Course with more information to follow.
